I first decided to pursue my doctorate in 1991 after realizing during my master's work that there had not been enough solid data on the growth processes which we hoped to facilitate through study abroad, then a burgeoning field. I have since not only published and presented my own multimethod longitudinal research and consulted to many colleges, but I have also tried to resource broader scholarship and assessment efforts in the field however I can. I was part of the first meetings to establish The Forum on Education Abroad, served on its initial Outcomes Assessment committee, and wrote a chapter in its handbook on that topic. I have served on conference

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committees for NAFSA: the Association of International Educators, American Council on Education Internationalization Collaborative, Association of International Education Administrators, and Diversity Abroad, always with an eye toward increasing the quality and quantity of scholarship being disseminated. While my own scholarship is now expanding into broader areas of higher education leadership, I try to keep a finger in the field of international education and still serve on the board of ISEP (International Student Exchange Program) and the college advisory board of the Institute for American Universities.

I was therefore honored to be invited to become the next editor of Frontiers, the premier peer-reviewed journal in our field. The imperative to equip our students with the intercultural competence necessary to collaboratively solve the complex global problems we face is more urgent than ever.
